President Barack Obama's administrative actions granting temporary deferral of deportation for an estimated 40 percent of the 11 million people in the United States without legal immigration status received support from Catholic organizations, labor

unions and immigration advocates even as critics contended that his action violated the Constitution. Advocates for the immigrant community, including national and international church agencies, continued their call for Congress to enact comprehensive immigration reform that would include much of Obama's executive actions announced Nov 20. Among supporters of Obama's action was Archbishop Thomas G. Wenski of Miami, chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development. "What President Obama did will provide relief for a significant number of people," the archbishop told Catholic News Service Nov 21. "But it's just that. It's sort of like putting a Band-Aid on a wound. We still need Congress to act to provide comprehensive immigration reform. That's the real solution."

The Catholic Church "is a mother without limits and without borders," welcoming and assisting all of God's children, particularly those fleeing violence, oppression and poverty, Pope Francis said. Addressing the Vatican-sponsored World Congress on the Pastoral Care of Migrants, the pope said the Church's concern for the whole person motivates its material aid to immigrants and refugees, its offer of legal assistance and especially its pastoral outreach and offer of the sacraments. In the Christian community, he said, "no one is a stranger and, therefore, everyone is worthy of being welcomed and supported." For those uprooted from their homelands and facing the daunting task of integration into a new society, the pope said, the church is called to be "a source of hope: She develops programs of education and orientation; she raises her voice in defense of migrants' rights; she offers assistance, including material assistance, to everyone, without exception, so that all may be treated as children of God."

Jesus did not use his authority and divine power to rule and control people. He came to make people free. Hence, let us approach Jesus with trusting faith so that he may free us from the evil spirits that keep us from praying and prevent us from loving and sharing our blessings with others. He also frees us from all the "evil spirits" of fear, compulsions, selfishness, anger, resentment and hostility. "I have come that they may have life, life in abundance" (Jn 10:10). So Jesus should be a source of liberation for us. May he free us from all those spirits which make us deaf, dumb, blind, lame and paralyzed, physically and spiritually. Through Word and Sacrament, he brings that power to us and says to the demons in our life, "Be gone!" He says it as often as we need to hear it, over and over again, until by his power we are free from them all. Christ has power over any demon, whether that demon be an addiction, a heartache, a secret sin--whatever our need may be--Christ can set us free.



## INMIGRACION

Los inmigrantes indocumentados siguen en el centro de las luchas partidistas de Estados Unidos, luego de que el Congreso y la Casa Blanca no lograran un acuerdo sobre cómo resolver este asunto. El 20 de noviembre, el presidente Obama anunció acciones ejecutivas de inmigración para proteger mejor la frontera y regular a más de cuatro millones de inmigrantes indocumentados. Según la Casa Blanca, estas acciones permitirán buscar alivio de inmigración temporal a quienes han residido en EE.UU. Al menos durante cinco años, son padres de ciudadanos estadounidenses o residentes permanentes legales y no son prioridades de deportación, de manera individual por medio de registrarse, pasar una revisión de sus antecedentes y cumplir la ley. Estas acciones también podrían dar a más soñadores la oportunidad de pedir alivio de inmigración, a través de las Deferred Actions for Childhood Arrivals.

"Si usted ha estado en el País por más de cinco años, si tiene hijos que son ciudadanos estadounidenses puede salir de las sombras...pagar impuestos y seguir las reglas", afirmó el Presidente Obama en un discurso televisado a la nación, agregando que las medidas adoptadas no otorgarán ciudadanía, pero no le van a deportar. La administración Obama ha deportado a más de dos millones de personas.

La orden ejecutiva fue bienvenida y criticada. El Obispo Eusebio Elizondo, Presidente del Comité de Migración de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de Estados Unidos (USCCB) dio la bienvenida a la noticia de que el gobierno detendrá las deportaciones de muchos inmigrantes indocumentados y sus familias. "Tenemos una larga historia de acoger y ayudar a los pobres, los marginados, los inmigrantes y los desfavorecidos. Cada día, la Iglesia Católica en los Estados Unidos, en sus agencias de servicios sociales, hospitales, escuelas y parroquias, es testigo de las consecuencias humanas de la separación de familias, cuando los padres son deportados y separados de sus hijos o cónyuges entre sí. Hay constancia de que hemos estado pidiendo a la Administración hacer cuanto tenga autoridad legítima para llevar alivio y justicia a "nuestros hermanos y hermanas inmigrantes", dijo el obispo Elizondo.

"Los inmigrantes de México representan dos terceras partes de las personas que serán elegibles para el alivio de deportación bajo la orden ejecutiva del Presidente Obama, aun cuando representan aproximadamente la mitad de la población no autorizada del País", según un nuevo análisis del Pew Research Center. Ésta indica que 44 por ciento de los inmigrantes indocumentados de México podría solicitar la protección de deportación bajo los nuevos programas, en comparación con 24 por ciento de otras partes del mundo.

La orden ejecutiva de Obama no permite a los inmigrantes no autorizados obtener residencia permanente o ciudadanía; sólo el Congreso tiene la autoridad para ofrecer un camino al estatus legal. Como resultado de ello, si la administración entrante enero de 2017 decidiera revocar la orden del Presidente, ya no estarían protegidos de ser deportados.

El Obispo Elizondo instó al Congreso y al Presidente a trabajar junto para promulgar reformas permanentes al sistema de inmigración de la Nación para los mejores intereses de ella y los migrantes que buscan refugio aquí. "Seguiremos trabajando con ambos partidos para aprobar legislación que acoja y proteja a los inmigrantes, y promueva una política de inmigración justa y equitativa."
