**Extracts from the Vatican Information Service
Vatican City, May 5, 2015:**

“The Church which ‘goes forth’ is a community of missionary disciples who take the first step. ...Such a community has an endless desire to show mercy, the fruit of its own experience of the power of the Father’s infinite mercy. Let us try a little harder to take the first step and to become involved” (*Evangeliu Gaudium*, 24).

It is with this “endless desire” in mind that we read the Bull of Indiction of the Jubilee, *Misericordiae vultus*, announced April 11 in which Pope Francis details the aims of the Holy Year: beginning December 8, 2015 the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – the day of the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter’s Basilica – and concluding November 20, 2016, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the Pope’s desire that this Jubilee be celebrated not only in Rome but in all dioceses. This will give due focus to the life of individual churches and their needs; not to place an extra burden on local Churches, but to blend into our calendars and usual activities naturally.

Unlike previous jubilees marking time, this jubilee is based upon a theme. Its intent is to build upon the central content of the faith and call the Church once again to its missionary priority of being a sign and witness in every aspect of its pastoral life.

A calendar is being developed, which already include dates for celebratory events with large groups of people. Additionally, each month will be marked by significant efforts of reaching out to those on the ‘peripheries’ of society, in order to give a direct testimony to the Church’s affinity and care for the poor, the suffering, the marginalized, and all those who need a sign of tenderness. Local bishops and priests are asked to perform in their own dioceses similar symbolic gestures in communion with Pope Francis so that everyone may receive a concrete sign of the Church’s ministry of mercy and closeness. As a concrete sign of the Pope’s charitable love, effective measures will be taken to express mercy through tangible assistance to meet real needs.

Like other jubilee years, there is the invitation to pilgrimage. All the pilgrims who come to Rome will have a privileged route through which to walk through the Holy Door. In addition, young adults are invited to make the pilgrimage to Krakow joining the Pope for the World Youth Day.

What can you do between now and December 8? Visit the newly created website for the Jubilee: www.im.va. There you can read the Bull of Indiction and prayerfully consider how you can observe the jubilee. You can learn about the logo and contemplate its meaning. You can read a full overview of the calendar of events marking the various Days of Jubilee. And finally, you can link to the website through the various social media networks associated with the site.

Tal vez ustedes recuerden la película *Selma* que salió en los cines al inicio de este año. Se trataba de un grupo de afroamericanos que luchaban por su derecho al voto en Selma, un pueblo del estado de Alabama. Esto aconteció en los años 60, tiempos de segregación en donde la gente de color estaba despojada de su dignidad humana. El Dr. Martin Luther King surgía con una manera rara de luchar: por medio de protestas pacíficas. Él creó un movimiento de gente para protestar por sus derechos, no por la violencia o el hablar sucio, sino por medio de la verdad, con oración y maneras pacíficas; y por este motivo fueron maltratados, golpeados e incluso muchos murieron. Muchas veces la gente le preguntaba al doctor King, “¿por qué lo hace?” Algunos querían que usara métodos más violentos y hasta armados; pero el doctor King creía que la paz era la mejor manera de lograr su meta: llegar a la “tierra prometida”, como él se refería al momento cuando la igualdad de todos sería reconocida legalmente e implementada por lo que es, una parte fundamental de la condición humana ya que todos fuimos creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios.



Hubo una Fuerza que movió al doctor King a cambiar la historia de los afroamericanos en este país. Esta misma Fuerza lo llevó a seguir adelante en medio de amenazas y la violencia impuesta por los poderosos. Esta misma Fuerza es la Fuerza que una vez inspiró a los discípulos a predicar la Buena Nueva de Jesucristo. Esta misma Fuerza ha inspirado y fortaleció a un sinnúmero de gente para seguir viviendo una vida con sentido sin dejar de luchar por lo que es bueno, verdadero y dador de vida. Esta misma Fuerza es la fortaleza y creatividad que hace que las madres de familia críen a sus hijos. Esta misma Fuerza es lo que inspira a la gente a ir a trabajar para llevar el pan a sus familias. Esta misma Fuerza es esa voz misteriosa que nos invita a ser gentiles, a dar, a confortar y a alegrarnos con los demás. Esta misma Fuerza es el Espíritu Santo al que celebramos en Pentecostés.

Nosotros somos la Iglesia. La gente de Dios es la Iglesia. El Espíritu de Dios aletea en la Iglesia; por lo tanto, el Espíritu Santo aletea dentro de nosotros, inspirándonos a ser buenos, a vivir una vida que tenga sentido y fortaleciendo a los demás, para que sean la mejor versión de ellos mismos. Pentecostés consiste en darnos cuenta de que Dios está con nosotros y nunca nos va a abandonar, no importa lo que hagamos o no hagamos. Más aun, este darse cuenta se hace más fuerte cuando dejamos que Dios actúe en nosotros y por medio de nosotros; y justamente es aquí que encontramos nuestros pequeños *Pentecosteses*, los cuales llegan a toda hora y en todo lugar. Cuando dejamos a Dios actuar en nosotros, nos volvemos más conscientes y encontramos sentido en la vida; cuando dejamos que Dios actúe por medio de nosotros, somos fortalecidos para ser Cristo para otros, hasta el punto de entregar nuestra propia vida si es necesario, como lo hizo el Dr. Martin Luther King. Es así que hacemos que el mundo sea un lugar mejor para nuestros hijos y para sus hijos. En la Solemnidad de Pentecostés, pidamos a Dios Espíritu Santo que nos enseñe cómo podemos ser Cristo para otros y nosotros mismos.
