

Hunkering down to face life's inevitable adversity and suffering may lead us to close ourselves off from the world. That certainly is a temptation of some conservative Catholic thinking. Rejecting Vatican II with its call to involvement in and service to the world, some Catholics would prefer to promote the Church as a "refuge" from the world. Hermetically sealing ourselves off from the world creates an emphasis on the hierarchical and sacramental models of the Church. While these are important, so are the go out into the world and sanctify it models: models such as the church as a community of disciples, who encourage one another to serve and teach as Jesus did; the servant church (think Mother Theresa); and the church as herald (preach the gospel to the ends of the world). These and other models and ideals, such as the preferential option for the poor, all call for engagement in the world around us.

Serving American families through Catholic charities, colleges and hospitals are well established institutional examples of such engagement. The goal is to serve the human family; and not necessarily because they are Catholic, but because we are. We strive to meet the needs of all.

Maintaining our focus, serving and sanctifying the world, is not helped by the sad fact that we are influenced by secular society as much as we try to influence it. These days creeping secularism values individualism, materialism and consumerism more and more. Religion, ethics and morality are increasingly pushed to the periphery. A sad reflection of this is the rampant pattern of "hooking up" (gratuitous sex), especially in America's colleges. Whether seeking affection and love, or instant gratification, students at younger and younger ages are caving to peer pressure and this pervasive practice. Individual freedom, highly valued by secular society, permits anything and everything.

The antidote is the steady example of our Catholic Christian way of life and our happiness. Study after study has shown that the above-mentioned college crowd are disillusioned and unhappy. Sexual mores are only part of what's wrong with secular society. Greed, violence, putting oneself above the value of the group, the lack of respect for life at any stage or age, and the abandonment of religious practice are all on the rise.

Let us reject individualism and materialism, to bring witness to enduring values; notably love of God and neighbor. May we not so much blend in as stand out. It is in serving others that we find the happiness and joy that God gives—and witness it to others.

## OTRA VEZ ESE MOMENTO DEL AÑO



El verano va terminando y los colores del otoño y las suaves brisas recuerdan a los padres y a los niños una cosa... ¡el final de las vacaciones! Después de casi dos meses de diversión, dormir mas y libros que acumulan polvo, es hora de que los niños regresen a la escuela y se enfoquen en aprender. Junto con los nuevos útiles y ropas escolares, los niños pueden estrenar de nuevo objetivos y expectativas. Esto también puede dar a los padres nuevas oportunidades de enseñar a los niños responsabilidad, manejo del tiempo y la importancia de estar preparados.

Los padres pueden enumerar las expectativas que tienen sobre sus hijos de manera semanal, como recuerdo de los logros que pueden alcanzar.

Recuerde que "una escuela es un lugar privilegiado donde, a través del encuentro con una herencia cultural, tiene lugar una formación integral. Pedimos a los padres que le proporcionen a sus hijos las oportunidades de experimentar tal formación, ser parte de su educación y tenerlos de su lado. Ser el padre o la madre que todos los maestros conocen por su nombre porque están continuamente acudiendo a la escuela y siendo parte integral de la educación de sus hijos". Par algunos, el año escolar llega en una nueva escuela. Tanto si se cambia de escuela o se entra en otro grado, siempre hay una cierta ansiedad en comenzar todo de nuevo. En lugar de sentir temor, los alumnos pueden utilizar esto como desafío para un nuevo comienzo, hacer nuevos amigos y empezar el limpio. Todo lo que hagas desde este momento en lo que cuenta. Trabaja mas duro, estudia mejor, lega mas allá. Este nuevo año escolar puede ser el modo de comenzar con el pie derecho: ser puntual, estar preparado y dispuesto a aprender.

El nueve año escolar también significa otro año de catecismo. Tanto si los niños se están preparando para un sacramento o simplemente aprendiendo mas sobre su fe, este puede ser un año de acercarse mas a Dios. Como en la escuela, se les pueden dar a los niños expectativas de lo que los padres quieren que aprendan, den o practiquen. Por supuesto, los padres tienen que ser los modelos para esto. Los padres pueden ayudar a los niños durante el año yendo a misa como familia de manera constante; orando antes de las comidas, todas las mañanas antes de la escuela y todas las noches antes de dormir; y dando gracias a Dios por todos sus beneficios.

Unas cuantas pistas mas para un año escolar exitoso para padres e hijos:

- Duerman lo suficiente.
- Tomen un desayuno saludable.
- Oren diariamente.
- Hagan sumerjo esfuerzo,
- Utilicen buenos hábitos de trabajo, como anotar las tareas y entregarlas a tiempo.
- Tomen tiempo para hacer las tareas. Si no entienden algo, pregunten al maestro.
- Mantengan el sentido del humor y ¡diviértanse! Enfatizar el ser los mejores y no disfrutar los días puede ser peor que no intentarlo. Asegúrense de disfrutar con todo lo que hagan.

Pueden orar a algunos santos patrones de los niños escolares, como san Benito y el patrón de las escuelas, santo Tomás de Aquino.
