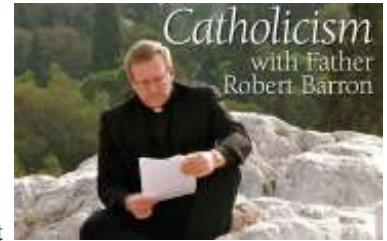

Cardinal Roger Mahoney, retired archbishop of Los Angeles, writes in "America" magazine that Pope Francis' homily in Lampedusa, July 8th on immigration, "challenges people everywhere to drastically reconsider our conversations about the immigrants living and working in our midst." As the House debates border security measures, legal protections for immigrant workers and whether to extend legal residency or citizenship status to undocumented immigrants, it is essential to keep in mind how these policies will affect the lives of our immigrant sisters and brothers.

The prospects of revamping the nation's immigration laws received a boost on June 27 when the Senate passed a reform bill, 68 to 32. John McCain of Arizona, Marco Rubio of Florida and Lindsey Graham of South Carolina – all members of the Senate's Gang of Eight who initially drafted the legislation – were among 14 Republicans who voted for it. The comprehensive landmark bill allows more visas for skilled laborers, a new visa program for farmworkers, greater workplace protections, a significant increase in border security and an arduous 13-year pathway to citizenship for most of the 11 million undocumented immigrants now in the country. The security measures, introduced late to draw additional Republican support for the bill, come with a \$46 billion price tag. The bill adds 20,000 border agents, completes 700 miles of fence along the U.S.-Mexican border and invests \$3.2 billion in technology upgrades.

Diverse interest groups have united to support an overhaul of the current system. Labor unions have joined with business interests, recognizing that immigration reform will strengthen the economy. Prominent conservative activists and donors, including the tax reform activist Grover Norquist, have voiced support for reform. Religious groups have inspired pre-reform efforts. Polls indicate there is overwhelming, bipartisan support for reform, including a pathway to citizenship, among Americans.

Meanwhile, undocumented immigrants pay taxes but cannot vote or obtain a driver's license. They have families but live in fear of deportation and separation from children. Senator McCain, speaking at an AFL-CIO event last month, said that "without the protections of citizenship," many of these immigrants could be exploited and mistreated in a broad variety of ways. That's not what America is supposed to be all about." This is the compassion Pope Francis described in Lampedusa.

Considering the recent popular support for reform and the political incentive to woo a growing Hispanic electorate, one wonders why House Republicans are hesitant to support the Senate's compromise bill.

EL LARGO CAMINO HACIA LA REFORMA MIGRATORIA

El 24 de junio de 2013, USCCB lanzó una nueva declaración sobre la reforma migratoria y su preocupación sobre la enmienda Corker-Hoeven. En la declaración, el Arzobispo José H. Gómez, que dirige el Comité de obispos sobre

Migraciones dijo: "La legislación ante el Senado de Estados Unidos incluirá la enmienda Corker-Hoeven, que aumenta de forma dramática la vigilancia de la frontera y requiere que se cumplan objetivos de recursos de seguridad inéditos antes de que los inmigrantes indocumentados reciban el permiso de residencia permanente. También elimina los créditos de Seguridad Social ganados por los inmigrantes indocumentados y exige el pago de impuestos atrasados".

Según Gómez, mientras que la doctrina social católica apoya el derecho de un estado soberano a controlar su frontera, los obispos están preocupados de que la enorme ampliación de recursos de seguridad impacte negativamente a las comunidades fronterizas, y que haga a los inmigrantes más vulnerables a los coyotes y a la muerte en lugares remotos de la frontera.

Los obispos también se reservan el derecho de oponerse a la reforma migratoria más tarde, si el camino a la ciudadanía se hiciera inaccesible o fuera eliminado. Sin embargo, USCCB considera que la legislación de reforma propuesta se debe mejorar de los modos siguientes:

1. El camino a la ciudadanía debe ser más asequible y accesible para los inmigrantes indocumentados y sus familias;
2. La unidad familiar debería ser favorecida en el sistema legal de inmigración;
3. Se debería incluir un programa factible y solido para trabajadores poco cualificados para entrar y trabajar legalmente, con protecciones laborales adecuadas;
4. Se debe restablecer en el sistema la protección a los procesos legales, incluyendo alternativas a la detención;
5. Se deben tratar las raíces de la inmigración.

"El proceso de arreglar nuestro sistema de inmigración, que ha estado dañado durante décadas, no terminará una vez que el Congreso apruebe la legislación de reforma migratoria. Los obispos católicos de Estados Unidos continuaran trabajando por la mejora del sistema migratorio, ahora y en el futuro," dijo el Arzobispo Gómez.
