DID YOU KNOW?

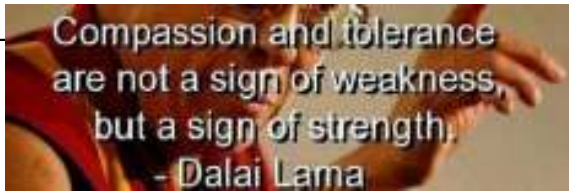
The people who visited Break of Life Food Pantry in 2014 live in Hart (59%), Shelby (16%), Mears (8%), Walkerville (5%), Pentwater, Rothbury and Hesperia (3% each). Many are on social security or disability, Food Stamps or WIC assistance. In about 1/3 of the households, at least one person works part-time or seasonally.

In April 2015 175 different households came to the pantry to supplement their grocery budgets. On average, 76 households came just over two times in April, for a total helped of 381 households containing 1470 people. Food for almost 14,000 people was distributed in 2014.

Today, when I witnessed a 27-year-old breast cancer patient laughing hysterically at her 2-year-old daughter's antics, I suddenly realized that I need to stop complaining about my life and start celebrating it again.



The landmark decision of the U.S. Supreme Court in Obergefell v. Hodges involves the question of who can contract a civil marriage. It accords with the opinion of a majority of U.S. citizens, as well as a majority of American Catholics. The court's decision also comes on the heels of a recent referendum in Ireland in which a large majority of Catholics across that country voted for the legalization of same-sex civil marriage.

The church is by its nature a public body. While the separation of church and state is a prudent arrangement, the separation of the church from politics is inconceivable, for the Gospel makes radical demands on every dimension of human living.

In the months and years ahead, however, Catholics should reconsider not whether the church should engage in the public life of this country but how we will do so. The present moment affords an opportunity for Catholics of every political stripe to assume an even more robust public presence, but from a different starting point: that of human encounter rather than of tactical confrontation. As Archbishop Wilton Gregory of Atlanta observed in the wake of Obergefell, this moment affords us "an opportunity to continue the vitally important dialogue of human encounter, especially between those of diametrically differing opinions regarding the ruling's outcome."

The same Gospel that Christians seek to announce in the public square requires that we engage in such a "dialogue of human encounter" in a penitential key, with humility. As Cardinal Reinhard Marx, Archbishop of Munich, has said, "We cannot say to someone: you are homosexual, you cannot live according to the Gospel. It is unthinkable... If two people in a homosexual relationship have been faithful to one another for 30 years, I cannot call that nothing." While acknowledging and preserving what is essential, Cardinal Marx adds, "We cannot see everything in black and white, in terms of all or nothing."

A new pastoral approach, therefore, should be marked by basic human respect, which "must be real, not rhetorical," as Archbishop Blasé Cupich of Chicago has said, "and ever reflective of the church's commitment to accompanying all people. For this reason, the church must extend support to all families, no matter their circumstances, recognizing that we are all relatives, journeying through life under the careful watch of a loving God."

For too long the public has wrongly perceived the church as one more political faction aligned almost exclusively with the forces of reaction. It is not surprising that in a country obsessed with all things sexual, the church should be seen as singularly obsessed with such matters. Our task is to change that perception in order to create a more fertile field for the seed of the Gospel.

The world is not ending; it is changing. It is unsettling for many, surely. Yet it is also hopeful. We are at our best when we encounter any change with the certain hope that everything has within it the power to call forth from us a deeper response to God. Above all, we have the grace of the one who has saved us, the one who now calls us to greater faith, deeper hope and lasting charity for all.

Los evangelios de los domingos de agosto nos hablan una y otra vez del seguimiento de Cristo en términos de sinceridad de corazón más que de prácticas externas. Empieza por una cuestión aparentemente inocente de Jesús: Ustedes me buscan porque les doy pan material... y termina por toda una lección de espiritualidad sincera más honda que las simples prácticas y los rituales.

Estas lecturas también suponen una fuerte exigencia a compartir con los demás y una llamada a la compasión y la misericordia. en el domingo 21 del Tiempo Ordinario se nos presenta claramente la opción: "¿Ustedes también quieren dejarme?", junto con la decisión de los discípulos. Fe, fidelidad y felicidad van unidas en esta decisión.

Agosto es un mes lleno de fiestas marianas y patronales. por todos los países hispanos se celebra la "Virgen de agosto". De especial relieve, al comienzo de este mes, es la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles, patrona de Costa Rica, y también patrona de una de las primeras ciudades de California, Los Ángeles, originalmente llamada la puebla de Nuestra Señora la Reina de los Ángeles. La Asunción de Nuestra Señora está en el centro de las celebraciones y va seguida por la fiesta de la proclamación de la Realeza de María, el día 22.

También agosto tiene un marcado sentido de martirio para nosotros, ya que se celebra la fiesta de los "Mártires de la Asunción", es decir, la comunidad entera del Seminario de Barbastro, en España, que dio su vida por su fe, en 1936.



Copacabana es una ciudad de Bolivia enclavada a orillas del Lago Titicaca. Según la tradición, Francisco Tito Yupanki, nacido allí de ascendencia real indígena hacia 1550, tuvo la visión nocturna de una mujer con un bebé en brazos. Inspirado en ella y su amor a la Virgen María talló en madera de magüey la imagen de la mujer con rostro oscuro y de características nativas. La población de Copacabana acogió la imagen con júbilo y la entronizó en una humilde iglesia de adobe y piedras el 2 de febrero de 1583. Así comenzó una gran devoción mariana que se extendió a otros países y ha llegado hasta nuestros días. La basílica actual data del año 1805. La imagen fue coronada como Reina de la Nación por el Papa Pío XI en 1925, durante la conmemoración del centenario de la independencia de Bolivia. La fiesta es el día 5 de agosto.
